## COVID-19 ACTION PLAN

The United States Equestrian Federation has issued requirements and recommendations for operating USEF-Licensed Competitions in the COVID-19 environment. USEF's purpose and scope is dedicated to ensuring the safety and welfare of horses and all participants. Please understand that there is no way to eliminate all risks related to COVID-19; however, NEC is abiding the most current requirements and following the most recent guidance from federal, state and other public health officials to help protect you, our event participants and our employees.

**FEEL SICK, STAY HOME.** Anyone feeling unwell at any time should not come to or stay at the facility. Anyone exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, or who has been tested positive or have been in contact with someone who has been tested positive for COVID-19 within two weeks of the event should not enter the facility. (*\*Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempt from this restriction*).

**BODY TEMPERATURE CHECKS.** Any individual with a body temperature of 99.5 F (37.5 C) or higher may not enter the facility. *Participants* including horse owners, lessees, riders, athletes, parents, vaulters, drivers, trainers, coaches, grooms, longueurs, navigators, personal care assistants (PCAs), and any other required support personnel/staff that are essential for providing care to the horses and/or the athletes must self-monitor their temperatures daily prior to entering the facility. *NEC employees plus* all event officials, staff, service providers, and volunteers will have body temperatures checked by non-contact thermometer daily by an NEC staff member before entering the facility.

**CLOTH FACE COVERINGS or MASKS.** All NEC employees will wear masks for the safety and comfort of participants. All individuals in attendance of the show must wear a cloth face covering, N-95 or KN-95 or surgical mask when in a public setting where it is *reasonably possible* to come within six feet of (an)other individual(s). Masks are not mandatory when mounted on horseback; however, no rider will be disqualified for wearing a mask while riding. Participants should supply their own cloth face covering or masks. A limited number of surgical masks will be available for purchase in the NEC Services Office.

**SOCIAL DISTANCING.** All participants plus competition organizers and staff and all individuals at NEC must *always* practice social distancing standards throughout the facility including outdoors on NEC property. Occupancy load restrictions establishing the maximum number of individuals permitted in a specific indoor area will be posted throughout the competition grounds. Only essential personnel will be permitted in the Show Office, and participants should expect restricted access when entering this area. Queues with ground-markers will help participants form a single-file line that maintains social distancing standards. Similar queues will be in café areas as well.

**FOLLOW THE FIVE.** The Center for Disease Control and Infectious Disease advises that everyone **1) Wash your hands often** with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry; **2) Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth** with unwashed hands; **3) Avoid close contact** with people who are sick, even inside your home. If possible, Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from other people. Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.

Do not gather in groups. Stay out of crowded places; **4) Cover your mouth and nose** i) with a cloth face mask when around others. You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick, and ii) If you do not have on your cloth face covering, remember to always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in the trash. Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds; **5) Clean and disinfect** frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks. If surfaces are dirty, clean them. Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.

Then, use a household disinfectant.

**ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY.** Competition organizers have the authority under GR702.1 and GR914 to remove from the facility any person who does not comply with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition. USEF Technical Delegates will inform individuals when they are not in compliance with the regulations and requirements and will report such situations to competition organizers.

# CLASS/DIVISION INFORMATION

To be eligible to participate as a rider, owner, lessee, coach, or trainer at Federation LITE competitions, persons need NOT be members of USEF or WDAA. EXCEPTIONS: *Amateur riders must have a USEF amateur card or else show in the Open division. Also, those wishing to be eligible for USEF HOTY awards must have USEF horse registration and be USEF members, and those seeking WDAA WHLPAP points must be WDAA members.*

**JUNIOR RIDER CLASS/DIVISION (JR).** Riders are eligible to compete in this class/division until the end of the competition year in which they reach the age of 18.

**YOUTH RIDER CLASS/DIVISION (YR).** Riders are eligible to compete in this class/division if they have not reached their 22nd birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

**AMATEUR RIDER CLASS/DIVISION (AA).** From the beginning of the competition year in which they reach 18, individuals riding in this class/division must possess a current Amateur Certification to be eligible to compete at a USEF licensed competition. Only active United States Equestrian Federation members may obtain amateur status (EXCEPTION: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-show basis at no cost). Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules.

**OPEN CLASS/DIVISION (O).** Individuals competing in these classes/division have no restrictions based on horse or rider.

**A TRAINER** is defined as any adult who has responsibility for the horse on the competition grounds and must sign the entry form.

**CLASSES/CONSECUTIVE LEVELS PER DAY.** A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two (2) consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, and no more than four (4) rides per day at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders.

**AWARDS FOR CLASSES.** Ribbons to fifth place for each class; award for first place with competition only. Divisions (JR/YR, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. Riders competing in Amateur Rider classes must present a USEF Amateur card. When no division designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. Riders may enter only one division per class; any additional prizes will be posted at the Show Office. No awards or ribbons will be mailed. Exhibitors must be present to pick up awards and/or ribbons.

**AWARDS FOR HIGH SCORE & HIGH POINT IN SERIES:** Due to event cancellations related to the COVID-19 pandemic, THESE HAVE BEEN CANCELLED FOR 2020

**TENTATIVE DAILY SCHEDULE.** The below shall be subject to actual entries received and USEF scheduling requirements. Hardcopy ride times will be posted in the Show Office by 12:00p on the Friday immediately preceding competition. Digital copies will be posted at [www.necstl.com](http://www.necstl.com) and/or emailed to riders no later than the evening prior to event move-in at the Facility.

# ENTRY INFORMATION

**ATTENTION:** As of January 01, 2019, if you are a USEF competing member 18 years of age or older, you are **REQUIRED** to take the core Safe Sport training within 30 days of activating your USEF membership. Take the Safe Sport Training at [USEF.ORG](http://USEF.ORG) by logging into your member dashboard.

**CLOSING DATES.** Closing date for Show Me Series Western Dressage Shows are as follows:

Entries must be post-marked by the respective show's closing date to avoid late-entry fees.

**CONDITIONS OF ENTRY.** All horses present at this show participate entirely at the horse-owner's risk. All Owners, Agents, and/or Participants understand and agree that every horse entered, or which they bring to the National Equestrian Center, will be subject to the rules of the National Equestrian Center and its Show Management. However, the National Equestrian Center and its Show Management in no case shall be responsible for any loss, damage or injury that may occur to any person, horse or property on the show grounds, and it shall be a condition of entry that each

exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the United States Equestrian Federation, the Western Dressage Association of America, any additional recognizing organizations and the National Equestrian Center, its Show Management, directors, managers, employees, contractors, agents and volunteers for any loss or accident to exhibitors' horse, horses, person, persons or property which may occur.

All Owners and Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees, guests or animals to stalls, buildings and/or other properties on the show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services, shavings and feed shall be due and payable during the show. Show Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid balances due for property damage or bills for veterinary, farrier services, shavings and feed from premium, stake or prize money or refunds due to the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting obligations to the official veterinarian, farrier, shavings or feed supplier will be termed an undesirable exhibitor, and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

By entering a United States Equestrian Federation licensed LITE Competition and signing the associated entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longueur and on behalf of one's self, principals, representatives, employees and agents, you agree that you are subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. You agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition, and you accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. Additionally, you represent that you are eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse you enter is eligible as entered. You also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of you and your horse(s) taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product, and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. You expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

**RESERVED RIGHTS OF SHOW MANAGEMENT.** To Change Prize List: Show Management reserves the right to make changes to the Prize List as deemed necessary by the Show Management. Under USEF GR904: "If the prize list must be changed after it has been distributed to potential exhibitors the following procedures [will] be followed. Notification of specific changes to a prize list must be made to the Federation and exhibitors via email or mail as well as being posted on [the] competition's website."

To Vary, Add or Reject for Cause: Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials; to refuse any entry for cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause – all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show Management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of these competitions.

To Cancel Classes: Show Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any offered Championship or qualifying classes. No refunds will apply.

To Interpret Questions and Conditions: Show Management reserves the right to interpret questions and conditions in regards to and arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by Show Management, and its decisions will be final.

**ENTRY PROCEDURES.** Only one horse/rider combination per entry form; separate entry forms for each show. All Exhibitors are invited to enter on-line at [www.equestrianentries.com](http://www.equestrianentries.com) or by U.S. Postal mail. Entries submitted by other method such as fax or email may be rejected or subject to additional fees. Make checks payable to The National Equestrian Center. **ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:** Entries will be accepted on a first-come first-serve basis and must include all fees, membership and horse registration proofs (as appropriate), horse health documents, signatures, and payment in full. Only U.S. Funds will be accepted. Entries without payment may be rejected. Bridle numbers will not be issued without full payment and completed entries, including signatures, pertinent identification numbers, negative current COGGINS, etc. Three (3) year old horses entered in the show must provide proof of age with entry.

Entry forms require a TRAINER SIGNATURE, even when an owner and/or rider does not have a designated, third-party trainer.

**COGGINS REQUIREMENTS / HEALTH CERTIFICATE LAWS:** Equines residing in Missouri must be accompanied by a current negative COGGINS for EIA conducted within (12) twelve months of the competition dates. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit are NOT required for

Missouri equines. Equines entering Missouri must be accompanied by a current negative COGGINS test for EIA conducted within (12) twelve months of the competitions' dates and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within (15) days of entry into the State. The state of Missouri also requires an Entry Permit which is issued by the Missouri Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Health. Permits may be obtained by calling (573) 751.4359. \* Note: Current health certificates and negative COGGINS reports accompanying out-of-state horses must comply with the requirements of Missouri State as well as the state in which the horse resides (e.g., KY horses must have a negative COGGINS report within six months). Competitors must present health certificates for their out-of-state horses to the Show Secretary in order to pick up show packets. Out-of-state horses without a current health certificate will forfeit entry in the show and must leave the show grounds immediately.

**RHINO/FLU VACCINE REQUIREMENT: USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule:** 1) At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six (6) months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian; 2) In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3) In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. 4) In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5) Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. *BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.*

**ENTERING NON-COMPETING HORSE.** Non-competing horses will be accepted upon payment of all non-compete fees, stabling fees, and office fees plus receipt of a completed entry form, including signatures, and current horse health documents.

**FREESTYLE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS.** Freestyle competitors must declare to show management (and consequently the judge) at what level she or he will be riding and must provide two (2) recordings of the music (in CD or digital file form) to which the Freestyle will be performed at LEAST (2) hours prior to designated sound check. Sound check time will be posted by show secretary in the show office. Other musical arrangements must be cleared through the Show Management in advance.

**FREESTYLE SOUND CHECKS.** The schedule for sound checks will be posted at the show by 10:00a the Friday immediately prior to the Saturday/Sunday show dates.

**POST ENTRIES.** Entries will be accepted to fill scratches, up to the start of competition and if scheduling permits. No late entry fee will be applied but a post-entry fee will be required in addition to the normal class fee. To be eligible for a post-entry, a horse/rider combination must a) be eligible for the class, b) must have previously entered in competition as a competing or non-competing horse, c) register with the Show Secretary and put name on waiting list. Post entries in classes will only be accepted to fill scratches in allotted time slots that are available ("allotted" time slots are determined by the Official Schedule posted at the Show Office). Exceptions will be made when two or more competitors meet the same criteria and are deemed equal in priority status. Exceptions may also be made when conditions are created by weather or other natural disasters.

**ENTRY CANCELLATION/WITHDRAW:** Entries may be cancelled and withdrawn only in writing prior to or on the closing date. Cancellations made prior to or on the closing date will receive refunds of 50% class fees, all stabling fees and other fees less the office fees. Further refund consideration due to extreme veterinary or medical emergency situations will be at the sole discretion of the Show Management. Original veterinary/medical doctor's certificate must be furnished to the secretary within ten (10) days of cancellation. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER CLOSING DATE.** This includes classes cancelled due to accidents, severe weather, Acts of God or other emergency conditions. Late entry fees are non-refundable. Refunds will be mailed to competitors approximately 3-4 weeks after the show.

## FACILITY INFORMATION

**SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIRED.** Always keep a minimum of six feet (6') between yourself and others; wear face mask/covering when you are not alone; frequently wash your hands with soap and water; when soap and water are unavailable, use hand sanitizers; do not touch your face, eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands; use the bend of your elbow to cover your cough/sneezes. Please take appropriate action to plan ahead and to proceed with the safety of yourself and of our community as we return to the joy and benefits of horse showing.

**ARENAS & FOOTING.** The West Competition Arena (120' x 240') and its associated warm-up area (100' x 200') are comprised of GGT Footing™; an available indoor lunging arena and/or outdoor lunging pads are composed of all-weather sand footing. The West Arenas will be closed nightly for maintenance at 8:30p or following the conclusion of competition, whichever is the later time. Lunging areas will be available overnight.

**STABLING.** All stalls are 10' x 10' wooden box stalls located under permanent roof with floor screenings. Two (2) bags of bedding accompany each rented horse stall, and each horse-occupied stall must maintain at least two (2) bags of shavings on the floor at all times. EVERY HORSE MUST BE STALLED; no tie-outs/jump-outs are permitted. Violations may be subject to fines. Exhibitors may not re-locate to unassigned stalls. All stabling changes must be processed by Show Management. Stabling is by the term, not the day. Move-in begins 11:30a the day prior to the first day of competition. Stalls must be vacated by 11:59p the last day of competition. Requests to be stabled near specific Exhibitors must be made at the time of entry, and no stabling requests can be guaranteed. Exhibitors will be responsible for all damage to stalls. Do not disassemble walls or use screws, hooks, nails, or staples inside or outside stalls. Exhibitors should inspect stalls for damage and safety and report pre-existing damage to Show Management prior to use.

**STABLE AISLE OBSTRUCTION.** To facilitate social distancing requirements, all aisles in the barns must remain free from all obstruction. Bales of hay, feed, tack trunks, saddle/bridle racks, chairs, tables, floral décor and/or other accoutrements may not be placed in stall rows or on the center aisle. These must be kept inside an assigned tack stall. One-way directional traffic patterns may also be established in barn rows and aisles to accommodate more effective social distancing.

**BEDDING/SHAVINGS.** No outside bedding or shavings are allowed. All shavings must be purchased through Show Management in advance or during the show. Exhibitors with horses unable to use pine shavings for veterinary reasons must receive advance permission for alternate bedding. A veterinary letter may be required, and applicable clean-out fees will apply. Shavings will be delivered to stalls only after Show Management has received a secured method of payment. All shavings must be ordered by 4:30p to be delivered the same day. Once shavings are delivered, they cannot be returned for a refund.

## RULES, POLICIES & GENERAL INFORMATION

*Important notice to all affected parties* – Third parties may come upon the property or enter the Facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the Owner, Lessee or Organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

**CURRENT RULE CHANGES.** The rules governing these events may have changed in the USEF Rulebook. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current USEF Rule Book for any changes. Current rules can be found at the US Equestrian website, [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org)

**PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR REQUIREMENTS.** From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse on the competition grounds – including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in all classes and tests – must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet that meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

**EXTREME CAUTION MEDICATING HORSES.** Though this show does NOT include USEF Drug Testing Fees, Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Drugs and Medication Program, 3780 Ridge Mill Drive, Hilliard, Ohio 43026-9231 – Phone: (800) 633-2472.

**NO DRIVERS UNDER AGE 16.** In accordance with GR1301.7, minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**SCHEDULING OF CLASSES/RIDE TIME CONFLICTS.** Classes will be scheduled to accommodate the judges, riders and management. They may not be run in the order listed in the Prize Lists. It is the responsibility of the Rider to inform Show Management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Any ride-time changes need to be requested in the Show Office by 3:00p the day prior to competition.



**SCRATCHES.** Exhibitors have the responsibility of informing the Show Office of their intention to “scratch”. Scratches before the closing date shall be called a cancellation/withdraw and may be made for any reason. See ENTRY CANCELLATION/WITHDRAW for refund information. Scratches made after the closing date are liable for all unpaid bills/fees and will be charged accordingly. To scratch, please email the Show Secretary at [info@necstl.com](mailto:info@necstl.com). All scratches must be in writing.

**RIDE-TIME NO SHOWS.** All “No-Shows” that have not contacted the Show Office will be considered scratched for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled by other riders. Exhibitors understand and agree to this policy at the time of entry.

**BRIDLE NUMBERS.** Bridle numbers must be worn on the bridle/halter at all times a horse is being exercised or ridden. No Bridle Numbers will be given out without full payment of fees and/or a secured open check.

**LUNGING IN DESIGNATED ARENAS ONLY.** No lunging is permitted in arenas with GGT™ Footing or in main competition arenas. Lunging is welcome in the indoor lunging arena in Barn 5 and on the outdoor lunging pads.

**EARLY ARRIVAL/LATE DEPARTURES.** Exhibitors may have access to stabling beginning 11:30a the day immediately prior to the first day of competition and must vacate the Facility by 11:59p on the final day of competition. When animals, humans, tack, equipment, feed, supplies and/or other possessions occupy assigned stalls prior to the access date/time, Exhibitors will be responsible for early arrival stall fees; When animals, humans, tack, equipment, feed, supplies and/or other possessions occupy assigned stalls after the vacate date/time, Exhibitors will be responsible for late departure stall fees.

**AFTER-HOURS ARRIVALS.** Exhibitors who plan to arrive the National Equestrian Center after 8:30p should notify Show Management of an intended after-hours arrival so that the Facility may unlock assigned stalls and, if applicable, R.V. pads. **SHARPS DISPOSAL.** Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100.00 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers are located at the end of each barn aisle and within center aisles.

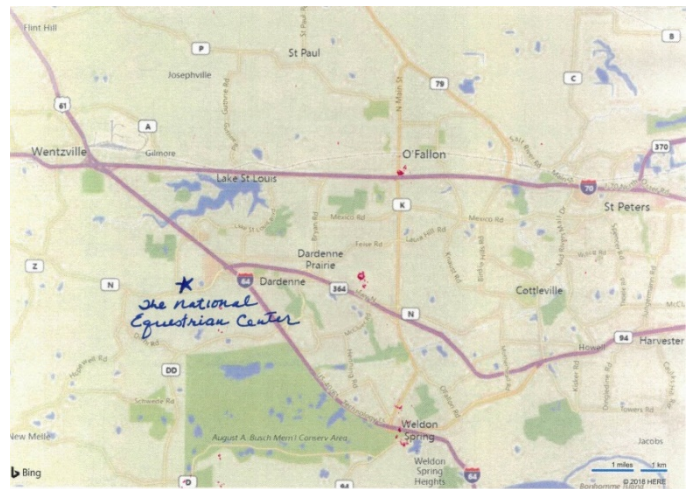

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian (“USEF”) allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and \_\_\_\_\_ (“USEF Event” or “USEF Events”); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the “Agreement”):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org), as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (“Risks”).
